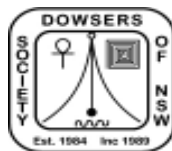

Leys, Sacred Sites and Beer Lines

A Visionary Landscape, touching on Alfred Watkins' work as a beer salesman. As the publication date for the BSD newsaletter is April 1, we thought this might go down a treat.

Since the publication of Alfred Watkins' book, 'The Old Straight Track', in 1925, it has been known that pre-reformation churches, standing stones, holy wells and other ancient sacred sites formed linear patterns on the landscape, now known as leys.

To the academic world, leys are a questionable phenomenon, a source of constant controversy. To the mystic, they are no enigma. They are pathways of the planetary life force, the Earth Spirit, which often manifests as an apparition of a goddess or white lady at significant nodal points along their length. Such apparitions, it is believed, gave rise to the sacred places which mark leys. Shortly after the publication of 'The Old Straight Track', a second, less well known book came out, dealing with a related phenomenon. It was Wilfred Atkins' book, 'The Wibbly Wobbly Way'.

Avebury Henge

Atkins had noticed that some leys not only included monasteries, abbeys and other sacred sites where beer is brewed, but ancient public houses where it is consumed. He suggested that Britain's pubs have their own ley system of Beer Lines. Its centre is at Avebury Henge, Europe's largest megalithic stone circle, or to be more precise, at The Red Lion, which stands at the centre of the circle. Radiating out from here is a network of Beer Leys linking pubs across the length and breadth of the land.



If this is correct, our oldest pubs were built upon ancient sacred places along the leys. They are power•points in the world grid where we can plug into the cosmic mains and our spiritual source. The Beer Leys which link them form part of the sacred landscape of Britain. Beer Leys are not straight like Alfred Watkins' leys. They meander wonkily across the landscape from pub to pub, like a drunk on a night out.

Atkins was quick to point out that this perfectly represents the influence of beer on the ley line system. However, it also mirrors the findings of experienced dowzers who have made a lengthy investigation of Britain's longest alignment, the Michael line, which runs right across the country linking a line of St Michael's churches from St Michael's Mount in Cornwall to Norfolk. They discovered that the Michael line actually contains two dowsable energy polarities which weave and meander around each other in exactly the same way as Wilf's Beer Lines.

Michael and Wilf (Sorry Harmish!)

Incidentally, the Michael line crosses one of Wilf's lines at Avebury. The exact spot is marked by a huge stone with a seat carved into it. It is a great place to carry a beer from The Red Lion, as the stone faces the mid- day sun at its zenith and can be a very empowering place to sit (please remember to take your beer glass back to the pub afterwards). Dowzers have much success in tracing these energy lines, so it is worth learning their techniques to find the most powerful places to attune to your beer. 'Beer energy nodes.'

If you have developed a degree of sensitivity, you will feel the energy of beer lines as a distinctly wobbly sensation as if you have just had a bottle of Stouidt's Abbey Triple (9%) on an empty stomach. When you find a really strong power point, you may suddenly find yourself incapable of standing and be caught up in a swirling vortex of energy that throws you to the ground. and breadth of the land.

Once you have identified a suitable spot, remain spread•eagled on the ground like a starfish and attune to it. Ignore passing comments like "Earth-

hugger” or “p***•artist”. Lie there until the dizziness wears off, then you can connect to the Earth’s power pulse and expand your consciousness to that of the planet. When you are at one with the planet, your aura will be roughly 25,000 miles in diameter. You will have grown in spiritual stature accordingly.

A lady stopped to talk to the dowsers and to ask about dowsing. She told us that a relative of hers, who lived locally, had once been asked by a couple of ‘hippies’, “*Do you know Jesus Well?*”

Object Found - Dowsing by Telephone

Anyone who ever doubted the validity of dowsing for lost objects, let this true story eliminate those doubts once and for all. I write this story to open dowsers' minds to the infinite possibilities that dowsing holds, so long as we approach it with the utmost respect, responsibility, and reverence.

I am a novice at dowsing. Four or five years ago I heard a few recordings by Harold McCoy, and later went to a beginners workshop led by Walt Woods. Dowsing was something that intrigued me from the start. Initially, though, I thought of it as an interesting topic for investigation, but not a practice I was interested in pursuing myself. Not, that is, until I lost something very precious and dear to me. It was a one of a kind rock artifact, a natural object I found in Colorado some twenty years ago, an object I had lovingly polished for hours on end.



From time to time I had been attending my local dowsing chapter meetings to find out what they might have to say about higher levels of consciousness. Being a big fan of psychology, philosophy, and mysticism, I found the dowsing community to be friendly and very open to “rubber-neckers” like myself, who stick their necks inside the meetings to see what is going on, yet

haven't plucked up enough courage to jump in feet first.

Well, all that changed because of my missing rock treasure. You see, some two and a half years ago, I changed residences. I put some of my possessions in storage, and kept many precious things at my apartment, including my rock piece and quite a number of books.

Then one day, it occurred to me that it had been some time since I had seen my rock object. Where was it? Was it in storage? Did my ex-wife have it? If it was in my apartment, why couldn't I find it? I looked high and low for two or three days, everywhere "important" where I would keep such a valuable object. Where could it be? My frustration mounted.

Then I remembered. I should get a dowser to find it. I got out my address book and made some initial enquiries, asking for the name of a dowser who specialises in finding lost objects. The answer was a nice lady by the name of Marge Hefty. I had spoken with her occasionally at the chapter meetings, but still, I barely knew her. I gave her a call.

"Hi Marge, you may not remember me, but this is Jasun Light. I was wondering if you could please do me a huge favor, and dowse for a lost object for me? It holds a lot of emotional and sentimental value for me, and I don't know where it is. It could be at my ex-wife's house, it could be at my place, I really don't know. Can you please help me?"

"Hang on, let me get my pendulum," Marge replied. Then she asked her Dowsing System, *"May I, Can I, Should I"*, Yes, yes, and yes.

Marge came back on the phone. *"OK, I can do it, just tell me how big it is."* I told her, *"It's only about half the size of the palm of your hand"*. (That was the only information I gave her about what it was).

Then, while working over the phone, Marge proceeded to ask her Dowsing System a series of questions. *"Is it at his ex-wife's house?"* No. *"Is it at his apartment?"* Yes. *"Is it in his living room?"* No. *"Is it in his dining room?"* No. *"Is it in his kitchen?"* No. *"Is it in the spare bedroom?"* No. *"Is it in his master bedroom?"* Yes. Then she asked me where the door was to the bedroom. I told her it was in the Southeast corner of the master bedroom.

Marge continued asking her Dowsing System, *"Is it on the East wall?"* No. *"Is it on the West wall?"* No. *"Is it on the North wall?"* No. *"Is it on the South wall?"* Yes. *"Is it on the floor?"* No. *"Is it one foot off of the floor?"* No. *"Is it two*

feet off of the floor?” Yes. Marge stopped the Dowsing session, and told me what she found out. *“Your lost object is in your master bedroom, on the South wall, two feet above the floor.”* I thanked her, and told her that if it was there, I would send her a bouquet of flowers. I relaxed myself, to take my mind off of it for a while. And then about 15 minutes later, I was ready to go have a look.

I went into the master bedroom. On the South side of the wall, there is a nightstand, which is about two feet tall. There on the nightstand was a huge pile of books, probably twenty or more, all piled up. I slowly removed the books, one by one. And there, on the nightstand, at the bottom of the pile, was my rock object! My jaw-dropped open, and I couldn't believe my eyes.

“Oh my God!” I was speechless. Needless to say, I was on my knees saying a silent prayer of thanks and extreme gratitude to the Field of Infinite Intelligence that makes dowsing possible. After I had managed to integrate what actually had just happened, I let myself calm down for ten minutes, then called Marge Hefty back on the phone and said, *“Oh My God, Thank you, thank you, thank you!”* My gratitude to Marge was deeper than mere words could express.

I asked her how it works. She gave me a brief explanation, saying that my superconscious mind knew where it was all along. She simply and politely asked her superconscious mind to communicate with mine, and her Dowsing System gave her the answers through the micro movements of her fingers and the physical evidence of the pendulum, swinging in the correct direction. Several leading dowsers have told me that there is nothing mysterious about it. It is simply another normal altered state of consciousness in which the brain is operating simultaneously across all brain wave frequencies, and working in a zone of optimum performance. This altered state is something that anyone can learn to utilize with practice and profound humility.

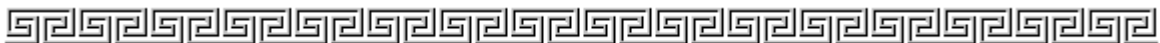
Being a novice at dowsing, I am not about to try to explain anything further than that. All I know is that dowsing works! And for any skeptics out there, all they need is to experience it first hand, and they will fall silent.

I always believed that dowsing works. Now I know it works because I have first hand experience.

I have taken a serious interest in dowsing, attending the Southwest Dowsing Conference, held in Flagstaff Arizona in 2007, and making some new friends within the dowsing community. I want to develop my own dowsing skills, but only with the greatest respect, responsibility, and reverence for this awesome gift from the universe.

I know I have only had a glimpse of what dowsing can do. But I firmly believe the amount of help we can receive from the Field of Infinite Intelligence is limited only by our beliefs and our capacity to ask the proper questions on behalf and for the benefit of all creation.

Here's my call to action to anyone who reads this article: ask your Dowsing System to help you and others, and start teaching these skills to the younger generation so that we can bring new disciples into this ancient art. And let us pray that they will use it with the highest of ethics to build a better world for all.

The Seminar is open to all, members and non-members.

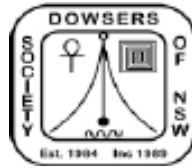

Bull's-Eye!

About ten years ago, I was asked to locate a drilling site (by dowsing) for a rural family who already had well dug on their property. The well produced only a marginal water supply, and for years, especially in dry seasons, water usage had to be carefully managed. They were building a new home and realized they would need a more productive water source. The property was located in an area known for difficulty in locating satisfactory groundwater supplies. Two dry holes had recently been drilled on the property, and the well driller suggested that the owner call us to try to locate a suitable drilling site.

Using the dowsing methods we had developed over the years, we could find only one live-water flow on the property. We followed the path of this flow and marked it on the surface as it meandered across the property. We selected a specific site where we believed a satisfactory well could be drilled. Before we left the property, we told the landowner to permanently mark the site because, in my judgment, it seemed to be the only promising site I could find.

We always keep detailed records of every dowsing job. Two years later, however, while paging through some of my old records, I discovered that I had never recorded the results of the drilling on this particular piece of property. I decided to call the landowner and ask about the well. “*You know*” he said, “*after you were here we began to get more rain, and we decided to use the old well after all. We figured we could always drill a new well if we had to. Since then, except for a few times, we’ve always had enough water for the new house, and we’ve been getting by okay*”.

I thanked him for the information and made a note of it in my files. Three more years passed. One day in early spring he called again, and asked if I



could come out to his property and locate another drilling site, because the dug well was no longer providing enough water for the house and he now had to drill a well. I asked if he had marked the site I previously selected, because that was the only promising site I could find at the time. He told me he had marked the site by driving a heavy

wooden stake into the ground, but with all the excavating for the new home, it must have been moved or buried. I told him I would return as soon as possible. When I arrived at the farm some days later, I discovered that everything had changed. The new house was under construction, but many of the old farm buildings had been torn down, and new sheds had been built.

I spent a few minutes trying my best to recall my previous visit. To save some time, I asked if he remembered generally where the site was that I selected previously. He said he had a rough idea, but couldn't be sure, because they had changed everything around, (including the original location for the new house).

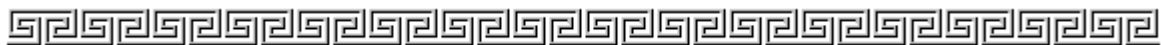
I started to work in the yard area, and soon found what seemed to be a good live-water flow and began to mark it out on the surface. As I was working, he told me he didn't think my markings were anywhere near what I had found before, which puzzled me. Groundwater flows never move. I was confident I was sensing what I usually look for, but he persisted by saying, "*I know this isn't anywhere near where you found it last time!*" I told him that from past experience, I had never known a live-water flow to move and that I didn't have any good explanation for what I was now finding.

The winter snows were fast disappearing at the time, and the ground was beginning to thaw. After working for a while, I decided to follow my instincts,

and selected a new drilling site. I spray painted a blue circle on the ground and told him to mark the site in such a way that the markings would not be lost again. He told me to wait right there.

Coming back with a spade, he told me it would be permanently marked “*this time by digging a hole in the ground*”! Shoving the spade into the soft muddy ground he encountered a small rock, or what he thought was a rock, and tried to dig it out. His next words were, “*well, I’ll be damned! This is the stake I put in the ground the last time you were here!*” He couldn’t believe it, and neither could I.

A good well was drilled a few days later. I will bet, however, that he still tells this story to anyone who’ll listen. I seldom miss, but if I were Robin Hood, I would consider this the arrow that split the arrow in the bull’s eye.

Installing LOVE / With Tech Support

- **Tech Support:** Yes, ... how can I help you?
- **Customer:** Well, after much consideration, I've decided to install LOVE. Can you guide me through the process?
- **Tech Support:** Yes. I can help you. Are you ready to proceed?
- **Customer:** Well, I'm not very technical, but I think I'm ready. What do I do first?
- **Tech Support:** The first step is to open your Heart. Have you located your Heart?
- **Customer:** Yes, but there are several other programs running now. Is it okay to install Love while they are running?
- **Tech Support:** What programs are running?
- **Customer:** Let's see... I have Past Hurt, Low Self-Esteem, Grudge, and Resentment running right now.
- **Tech Support:** No problem, Love will gradually erase Past Hurt from your current operating system. It may remain in your permanent memory but it will no longer disrupt other programs. The Easter Egg Origin

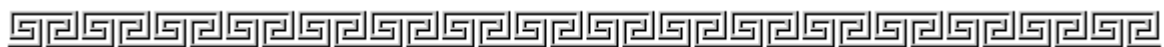

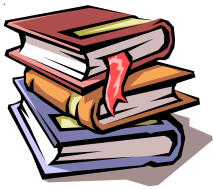

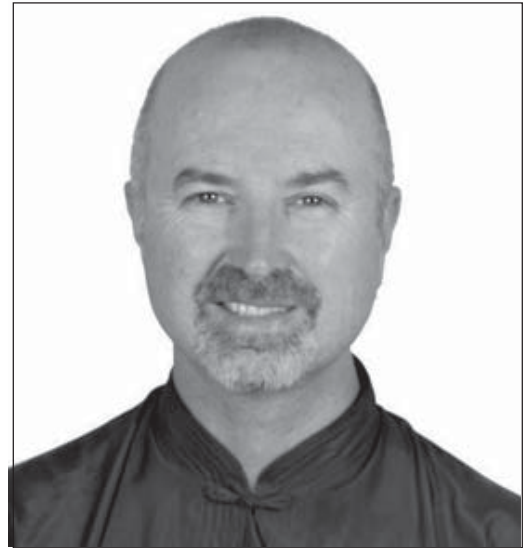
